PRIMARY ELECTION

The next election will be held on March 8, 2016. This Presidential Primary Election is funded by the political parties and therefore in order to receive a ballot you must declare a party and choose from the candidates of that party.

911 DISPATCH

Kent County has historically funded fire dispatch for the 21 Townships with an allocation from the Sheriff's Department budget. The cost to operate the dispatch center has risen dramatically as calls to 911 for medical and rescue calls, in addition to policing calls, have increased.

The county requested a cost sharing program with the Townships to help with the increasing equipment and operational costs, similar to the arrangement that charges the cities in Kent County. The Townships understand that there is a need to help fund county wide dispatch, however the Townships do not have the resources within their budgets without having to raise property taxes to fund dispatch costs.

The Townships requested that the County consider a ballot proposal in 2016 to increase the telephone surcharge by an amount to provide sustainable funding for all dispatch services in Kent County. The proposal is under consideration.

Grand Rapids Township remains committed to our primary responsibilities: provide essential services of Police, Fire and EMS; perform our constitutional duties of election administration, assessment of property and property tax collection; ensure that we promote appropriate land use regulations; support regional economic development; and provide for parks, open space and recreational trails.
